7. Presentation, consideration and adoption of the Annual Report for the 2020/21 season

Ashley Cardiff presented the 96th Annual Report for the 2020/21 season and thanked all that were involved in the production of the report with special acknowledgement of the efforts of Leanne Austin and Richard Cole.

8. Financial Report for the 2020/21 season

Ashley Brown, Director of Finance, presented the financial report as provided in the 2020/21 Annual Report and confirmed that the accounts had been prepared to satisfy the requirements of the Charitable Fundraising Act, the Associations Incorporation Act, the Australian Charities and Not for Profits Act, and the Club's Constitution and complies with Australian Accounting Standards. The accounts have been compiled by Beweiszter Accounting and Tax and independently audited by Peter Power in accordance with the applicable Australian Auditing Standards. Refer attachment 2.

9. Invitation to speak to the Report

The following guests spoke to the 2020/21 Annual Report.

The Hon. Rob Stokes, MP congratulated the Club on its 96th annual report and management of the Club through such a difficult season across all facets of the Club from surf sports, education and beach management. Rob congratulated the contribution the Club made to the broader community, in particular to Nathan and Mel Wellings for the incredible work they do with the 24-hour row as it demonstrated that the Club is not just looking between the flags and across the beach, but also back at the broader community and their needs. Rob acknowledged the passing of Club legends Don Imison and Reg Wood and congratulated Roger Sayers OAM as the recipient of an Australia Day Award. Rob congratulated and thanked Ashley Cardiff for his leadership through a very difficult period.

Mayor, Michael Regan congratulated Ashley Cardiff on his Presidency and Roger Sayers for his Australia Day Honours and acknowledged the thousands of locals in isolation on the northern beaches and the hardship endured by so many businesses over a difficult year. Michael thanked the Club for being supportive of government and NSW Health efforts, for fostering a good relationship with Council and thanked the community and members for their effort throughout the northern beaches Christmas cluster lockdown. Michael thanked the government representatives present for their support of surf clubs across the northern beaches as well as the Club's sponsors for their financial support. Michael reminded members to in turn support their sponsors in such difficult times. Michael stated that he was looking forward to seeing the NSW Championships being held on the northern beaches this year and wished our competitors the best of luck as they prepare for these events. Michael also thanked the board members for their efforts during a difficult year.

The Hon. Bronwyn Bishop congratulated Ashley Cardiff for his leadership through a difficult and often pessimistic time and acknowledged the spirit of surf life saving; dedication and commitment to others. Bronwyn acknowledged that Surf Life Saving is the third largest volunteer organisation in the country, and whilst women were not permitted to join the movement until the 1980s, that they were involved behind the scenes right from the very beginning. Bronwyn complimented the new mentoring program which identifies women who have leadership capability and a willingness to step up and congratulated Christine Hopton and Bernadette McKay for taking on the role of mentoring women at the Club. Bronwyn congratulated the Club on its prudent financial management and making sensible decisions to restrict expenditure where it wasn't necessary and to apply for the grants as they were available. Bronwyn congratulated Roger Sayers for his OAM stating it was tremendously well deserved. Bronwyn also thanked the board of management for undertaking the many tasks that make this such a strong club and the movement for being a strong pillar of the culture and society that Australians want to see.

John Brogden congratulated the Club on a great year and no lives lost at Avalon Beach. John acknowledged the difficulties of the past year and the impact on mental health within communities and thanked the Club and the movement for providing a place of support and connection during these times. John congratulated Ashley for three years as President, the board of management for delivering a strong financial result and everyone behind the scenes who have helped.

Steve Pearce, SLSNSW congratulated the Club on a successful season and for the support offered to the broader community over and above surf lifesaving through the support and commitment to mental health and welfare. Steve thanked Ashley Cardiff for his years of service to the Club and Presidency.

Cr Ian White thanked the members for their 5000 patrol hours this season and success on the sporting front and congratulated Ashley for his three years as President. Ian also congratulated the Club for their solar initiative and working towards the purchase of a battery.

Louis Tassone, Dir of Surf Sports, SLSSNB on behalf of Tracey Hare-Boyd and Branch executive team, congratulated the Club on an outstanding season and how much the Club was able to achieve considering the challenges presented throughout the season, noting that membership numbers were up as were the number of education awards gained by members. Attachment 1. President's welcome and summary of the 2020/21 season

Who would have thought that we would be here again dealing with Covid -19, a year after the last annual report, let alone been through the Avalon cluster? To have once again been forced to lock out our members and the club facilities around the Christmas period and again since this latest outbreak has been incredibly difficult not only for me but for the entire Board. For our Board of Management to have to isolate for 14 days after being exposed at the RSL in December was definitely a first, the first meeting I have missed. I once again would like to thank all our members for accepting the circumstances thrust upon us at this time and supporting the club through this period. We continue to comply with all the NSW Government and Health protocols and hopefully we have seen the last of our direct exposure.

A sad note this year has of course been the passing of two of our life members. Don Imison and Reg Wood have both passed this season and it must have been an incredibly sad time for the families of both men and has also been a sad time for the club. They were both a huge part of the fabric of our club, and they will be remembered with fondness. Vale Reg Wood and Don Imison.

On a brighter note, one of our other life members, Roger Sayers was awarded an OAM for his efforts and contribution to lifesaving and the community. Fantastic achievement and great recognition for Roger who continues to patrol and is a much-valued member of the club.

Our main focus throughout this season as usual is of course patrolling the beach and lifesaving and once again I can proudly say that no lives were lost at Avalon Beach this season. Once again, our patrols were on duty for more around 5000 hrs and the dedication of our patrolling members cannot be understated. A big part of this success is of course the job done by our Club Captains Nick Sampson and Jason Dale and supported by deputy Sophie Valentine. Co-ordinating the patrol roster and ensuring all the gear and equipment is up to standard and maintained throughout the year is no small feat. Supporting and assisting our patrol captains and senior patrol members share their knowledge, skills and experience and keeping up to date in an ever-changing patrol environment is a big advantage for our club.

Michael King and Louise Purnell have led our group of outstanding trainers once again throughout this season. It has been a stellar year with 58 new SRC members and 56 new bronze holders coming through the training team. Outstanding to think that we have that number of new Bronze members joining our club, this bolsters our patrol numbers and allows the club to regenerate with new faces and energy. Additionally, the IRB trainers have done a great job on driver and crew training adding to the ranks with those specialist skills. Great to see our ranks of Gold medallion holders increasing year on year. Well done all.

It was great for a large part of our surf sports team to be able to compete at Aussies this year after the disappointment of last year's cancellation. A team of almost 50 competitors, as well as family and friends made the journey to the Sunshine Coast for the event. The Boat team was our biggest contingent and several crews made it to the final day with the Hueys' getting a valiant 4th place with no help from the surf gods. The master's women's crew, the DB's, came away with a bronze medal in their division. The other standout for me was the boat relay teams competing in both the NSW State and National finals. The master's team has continued to also represent the club with several medals across numerous divisions. Great to see the usual names there but also some new master's competitors getting involved and doing well, shout out to Amanda "Gem" Lehmann and Julia Jones-Hughes with medals.

The IRB team had begun racing with the carnival season started and also well underway with some outstanding results well done all. Unfortunately, it has been brought to a premature end, hopefully to be rescheduled. Thanks to Terry Barber for overseeing the surf sports team.

The junior section of the club has been led ably once again by Tom Waters and his fantastic team of Age Managers. Once again allowing several of the groups to have time in the water at Palm Beach has been a good chance for those groups to develop and enhance their skills and spend quality time in the water. Tom has decided to step aside from the Junior President role, and I thank him for his dedication and efforts over the past few years and congratulate Dale Drain for nominating for the role.

The Bangalley Bar has had to endure this extended period of Covid-19, with shutdowns and restrictions being enforced. This has led to many functions being postponed or cancelled and the public bar unable to operate severely impacting our income through this space. However, in the period we were able to trade we had been able to rebuild quite considerably almost back to full strength. Collaborations with Sunny Eddy and Alphonso's via pizza nights and now Paella have been crucial in getting people out and about and visiting us once again. Thanks to Nick and Jason once again who have co-ordinated the lion's share of the bar work along with Johnny and Lija Wilson who have been able to bring together some of these partnerships.

Our new Director of Finance this year, Ashley Brown has done a great job to navigate some still significant headwinds following the lockdown and restrictions. Along with Bernadette McKay they have been able to claim all levels of

assistance to help us get through this period and have us sitting in a strong financial position. The BoM must also be congratulated for taking a frugal approach to expenditure throughout this time.

Our sponsors have been fantastic once again sticking with us throughout this tough commercial period. I must make mention of some outstanding donations from McGrath Real Estate and from The Avalon Palm Beach Chamber of Commerce. We would be struggling to operate without their support and generosity, and I cannot understate how grateful we are to have these relationships. McGrath Real Estate – Avalon Beach, Avalon Beach RSL, Active Tree Services, Brown Bros Skip Bins, Cross-Fit and Edcon Steel to name a few.

The BoM will remain relatively stable once again with minimal changes taking place. It is one of the strengths of this club that we have smooth transitions of management and changes take place with little or no disruption to business. Having said that, I will not be contesting the role of President at this meeting and will seek another role to. This will see me having completed three years at the helm and I'm sure the new President will have some great ideas and energy to bring to the job. I have enjoyed the role immensely including the challenging times and encourage others to put their hand up for these and other positions. Attachment 2: Financial Report for the 2020/21 season

These accounts cover the period 1 May 2020 to 30 April 2021.

The 2020-21 season presented us with many challenges in the face of COVID-19. Each month, we saw changes to the way the club was required to operate. It reminded me of turning up at a surf Carnival where surf conditions are always different and not as expected. However, what we did know was that we needed to adopt and innovate to continue to operate effectively. A good example of this was the successful Silent Auction fundraiser.

The profit and loss report records a healthy surplus of \$102,240, which was better than our budgeted expectations. Contributing to this surplus was additional Government, Surf Life Saving NSW and Surf Life Saving Australian grants received most due to COVID. This provided a welcome offset against declines in other revenue streams affected by COVID, such as bar function and community hire. However, towards the end of the financial year, as government restrictions eased, our community hire and Bangalley Bar revenue both returned to their pre COVID levels.

Some of the challenges around funding during the period included the cancellation of the Club's major fundraising event, Carols at the Beach. However, at short notice, the Club formed a Christmas silent auction committee. This committee did a fantastic job putting together a very successful fundraiser and in doing so, raised over \$30,000 for the Club.

Due to bad weather, this year's Around the Bend's ocean swim was cancelled and no income was recorded for this event in the accounts. This year, it was decided to discount membership fees as a way of retaining members and the shortfall was covered by a grant from Surf Life Saving NSW. Our Nipper membership numbers and revenue have continued to grow over the past three years and now represent our largest income category. Due to COVID restrictions, both the bar and function income was lower than the previous years, however, community hire income recorded a steady improvement on the prior year.

On the expenses side of the ledger, and with the uncertainty of the impact of COVID, expenses were kept to a minimum and focused on essential purchasing only. Costs of sales which includes bar and uniform purchases were down on the prior year and consistent with the reduced sales in the bar area. In regard to uniforms, stock that was purchased in the prior year was sold down which helped to reduce our purchases this year.

Overall, expenses were reduced by around \$91,000 from \$454,000 in 2020 to \$363,000 in 2021. The value of assets on the balance sheet increased from \$390,000 to \$504,000 and the Club's cash position increased by \$134,000 from the prior year. Capital acquisitions during the period included a 33-kw photovoltaic solar system, IRB motors, a new fuel storage cabinet, 25 new Nipper boards and 4 new rescue boards. Administration equipment was purchased with the proceeds of an Australian Government Volunteer Grant.

Liabilities increased by \$11,900, mostly due to the Ocean Swim entries (\$6,500) that will be rolled over to next year and some increases in trade creditors as detailed in Note 5 in the accounts. Overall net assets increased by \$102,000 from \$355,000 to \$457,000, in line with the profit for the period.

In summary, as we move forward into 2022, we are again challenged with the uncertainty of COVID and the massive disruption that causes to the Club's operation. However, I can confirm that, financially, we are well equipped to achieve our strategic objectives, to save lives to create great Australians and to build a better community. Thank you.
